Motion by Campbell, second Tardino, to approve the June 8, 2026 Regular Meeting minutes. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

The June 30, 2026 treasurer's report was filed with no corrections.

Bills

The bills were reviewed. Motion by Campbell, second M. Bowen, to approve payment of \$53,986.23 in the General Fund, \$466.83 in the Major Street Fund, \$3,135.36 in the Local Street Fund and \$169.11 in the Farmers' Market Fund for June 30, 2026 bills and transfers. Motion carried.

Recommendations/Reports from Council Committees and Village Officers

1. Reznick presented a proclamation to Rick Hicks Jr. for his thirty-six years of service to the community as the Village Barber at Rick's Family Barber Shop. Reznick also reported on storm damage, nominating petitions and the Phase II assessment for the proposed community center properties.

2. Tiedeman provided a report.

3. Campbell reported on the June 30, 2026 Recreation Committee meeting.

Unfinished Business

1. No unfinished business was presented.

New Business

1. Reznick presented an MDOT Resolution for Signature Authorization for contract #26-5109. Motion by Campbell, second Haidamous, to approve the resolution. Motion carried. (Copy attached.)

2. Reznick presented the MML ballot for three candidates for three positions. Motion by Haidamous, second Tardino, to approve the slate. Motion carried.

3. Reznick presented a budget amendment resolution for salt truck repairs. Motion by Haidamous, second J. Bowen, to approve the resolution. Motion carried. (Copy attached.)

4. Reznick introduced the bid recommendation from Wolverine Engineers for W. Quincy Street drainage repairs. Discussion followed regarding accepting the bid or rebidding next spring; full gutter versus rolled curb as permanent fix; responsibility for current situation; difference in bid amounts and costs. Motion by Campbell, second J. Bowen, to accept the bid from Lopez Concrete Construction, LLC. Motion carried, Tardino opposed.

5. Tiedeman explained that Haidamous' term as the ex officio member on the Planning Commission has expired. Motion by Tardino, second Campbell to reappoint Haidamous. Motion carried.
